A6. Responder can bid a suit at the 2 level when his HCPs added to the number of cards in his longest suit = 14 or more, then bid that suit at the 2 level

A8. Responder should bid $2 v$
You have 4 card support for Opener's bid suit and so a 'SUIT FIT'
The first rule for Responder is to support opener's bid suit if you can, especially if it's a major

A10. Yes, Responder has the required 5 -card heart suit to bid $2 v$ after a 1 -of a suit opening bid by partner. Why? The 2 bid uses up a lot of bidding space. Opener will know responder's $2 v$ bid promises 5 cards

A1. No fit with Opener's heart suit, no 4-card spade suit, and doesn't meet the Rule of 14 to bid at the 2 level! But Responder has 8 HCP so MUST bid!
Bid 1NT - the dustbin bid. It's all that's available!

A3. With TWO 4-card suits of the same rank, i.e. both majors or both minors, open the lower suit.
With TWO 4-card suits of different rank i.e. a major and a minor, open the major

The dreaded 4,4,4,1 hand
A5. Always open a minor
There is no 'correct' bid. but if you must lie as in the case of a 4441 hand, better to lie in a minor suit.
