A2. NO. All hands where Opener bids a second suit show at least 5 cards in the first bid suit and 4 cards in the second i.e. an unbalanced hand. (Remember the one exception - the 4441 hand which cannot show a 5-card suit so you 'lie' in a minor)

A4. To bid 1NT Opener must have 12-14 HCPa) With 11 or 12 HCP's Responder bids 2NT (nviting) Opener to bid game if maximum - 14 HCP.b) With 13 HCP Responder bids 3NT, Game
