GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SYSTEM

Bidding Methods:- 15-17 NT, 5-card majors, short Club, Benji 2's.

Style of leads, signals, discards:- Reverse Attitude signals, McKenney discards

ASPECTS OF SYSTEM WHICH OPPONENTS SHOULD NOTE

STRENGTH OF 1NT OPENERS: 15 - 17

2♣ RESPONSE TO 1NT OPENER IS: Stayman
