



Lesson 1 – Quiz Answers



Clubs are trumps. West has just won a trick, and leads a club in the first example, and a diamond in the second example of hands below. You can see all 4 cards played. Who has won the trick in each hand?



This time we are playing the same hands but in No Trumps. Who has won this time?

South North

What is the point count of these hands?

Are they balanced or unbalanced hands?

a) ♠ K Q 3

♥ A K T 8 7 17 HCP **♦ A J 6** Balanced

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♥ T 8 7 6 13 HCP

♦ 8 Unbalanced – you have a singleton

♣ A K J 6

c) • KQ975

♥ Q J 12 HCP

♦ **73** Unbalanced – you have 2 doubletons

♣ A 7 4 3

6 Write down the order of ranking of the suits including NT

No Trumps - highest ranking

Spades

Hearts

Diamonds

Clubs lowest ranking

If I win the Auction with a bid of 5 Diamonds, how many tricks does that mean I have to win to make my contract?

I contract to make 5 (that is to take 11 tricks) with Diamonds as trumps
