2 Your partner opens 1ヵ. What do you respond with these hands?

| A | - Q 652 | 24 |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
|  | - J 87 | Why? |
|  | - 762 | You have 4 card support for partner's suit and |
|  | * QJ4 | 6 HCP. You are just strong enough to raise to the 2 level. |
| B | - AQ62 | 44 |
|  | - AK 8 | Why? |
|  | - 762 | You have 15 HCP and 4 card support for |
|  | *Q94 | partner's suit. Partner has $12+$ HCP. $12+15=$ |
|  |  | 27 HCP You have enough strength for game so bid it |
| C | - 63 | 1NT |
|  | - A 76 | Why? |
|  | - KT97 | No support for partner but 7 HCP so |
|  | * T94 | must bid! No other bid available. |
| D | * 98763 | Pass |
|  | - 95 | Why? |
|  | - A 86 | 5 cards in partner's suit but only 4 HCP. |
|  | * T94 | You need 6+ to bid. |

C Opener

A
Pass. Opener has 15 HCP. Responder's minimum raise shows 4 card support but only 6-9 HCP. Even if partner has the maximum for his bid there is not enough for game i.e. $15+9=24$

B
4v. Opener has 16 HCP and a good 5 card hearts suit. Responder's jump raise shows 4 card support and 10-12 HCP. Even if partner is minimum for his bid you have enough for game so bid it! $(16+10=26)$

## C

Pass. Opener has 15 HCP. Responder's 1NT bid denies 4 cards in hearts and shows 6-9 HCP. Opener has only 4 cards in hearts and a balanced hand so is happy to play in NT but the partnership has not enough for game even if responder is maximum for his bid $(15+9=24)$

|  | - QJ976 | Why? |
|  | - T | Top of touching honours - no point |
|  | * 876432 | leading singleton Diamond - you don't want a ruff. Your Ace Spades is always making. |

5 What is your score in the following situations? ? Assume your side is non vulnerable in all cases.

A You are in 3a and you make 3 (taking 9 tricks)
140. You get 30 for each major suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made.

B You are in 3a and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks)
170. You get 30 for each major suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made.

C You are in 4 Diamonds and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks)
130. You get 20 for each minor suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made. Did you remember that in a minor suit you need to bid and make 5 to score the game because a minor suit trick is only worth 20?

D You are in 4 Hearts and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks) Your side is non-vulnerable.
420. You get 30 for each major trick made $(4 \times 30)=120$ plus a game bonus score non vulnerable of 300 gives a total of 420 .

E What is your score in Question D above if your side was vulnerable?
620. You get the same trick score of $4 \times 30=120$ but your game bonus vulnerable is 500!
