

Opening 2NT and Responses

The opening bid of 2NT is just like the opening bid of 1NT – but a whole lot stronger. It shows 20-22 HCP (no more, no less) in a hand with balanced distribution – no singletons or voids.

When you have at least half the points in the pack in your own hand you do not need a lot of help from partner to make game. Responder should bid on with *4 or more high* card points. Do not worry about all the suits that you are weak in – partner has them covered.

The responses are just the same as the responses to 1NT, but a level higher.

The only difference is that partner does not need to be rescued! Your aim is to find the best game or pass. You can use Stayman and Transfers to check for possible 8-card fits in a major just as you do over 1NT.
