



Lesson 4 - Quiz Answers

Opening 1 of a Suit

1 What would your opening bid be with these hands?

- A ♠ A K T 1♦
 ♥ T 9 8 7 Why?
 ♦ A K 7 6 5 *Open longest suit first*
 ♣ Q
- B ♠ Q 6 5 2 *Pass*
 ♥ A K J 9 8 Why?
 ♦ 7 6 2 *Insufficient HCP*
 ♣ T
- C ♠ Q 6 5 3 2 1♠
 ♥ A K Q 7 6 Why?
 ♦ 7 *Higher of 2 five card suits*
 ♣ K Q
- D ♠ Q 6 5 2 1♥
 ♥ K Q 9 8 Why?
 ♦ A K 2 *Lower of 2 four card suits*
 ♣ K Q *of the same rank (in this case 2 major suits)*
- E ♠ K Q 5 2 1♠
 ♥ 9 7 Why?
 ♦ A K J 8 *With 2 four card suits - one major and one*
 ♣ Q J 4 *minor, open with the major suit first*

2 Your partner opens 1♠. What do you respond with these hands?

- A ♠ Q 6 5 2 2♠
 ♥ J 8 7 Why?
 ♦ 7 6 2 *You have 4 card support for partner's suit and
 ♣ Q J 4 6 HCP. You are just strong enough to raise to
 the 2 level.*
- B ♠ A Q 6 2 4♠
 ♥ A K 8 Why?
 ♦ 7 6 2 *You have 15 HCP and 4 card support for
 ♣ Q 9 4 partner's suit. Partner has 12 + HCP. 12 + 15 =
 27 HCP You have enough strength for game so
 bid it*
- C ♠ 6 3 1NT
 ♥ A 7 6 Why?
 ♦ K T 9 7 *No support for partner but 7 HCP so
 ♣ T 9 4 must bid! No other bid available.*
- D ♠ 9 8 7 6 3 Pass
 ♥ 9 5 Why?
 ♦ A 8 6 *5 cards in partner's suit but only 4 HCP.
 ♣ T 9 4 You need 6+ to bid.*

3 What is Opener's rebid in the following examples after partner makes these limit bid responses? Why?

A Opener
 ♠ J 4 3
 ♥ A T 6 3
 ♦ A Q 7
 ♣ K J 6

1♥ 2♥
 ?

B Opener
 ♠ K 8 3
 ♥ Q J T 8 6
 ♦ A Q T
 ♣ A 7

1♥ 3♥
 ?

C Opener
 ♠ A J 6 2
 ♥ A Q 6 3
 ♦ Q J 2
 ♣ J T 3 2

1♥ 1NT
 ?

A

Pass. Opener has 15 HCP. Responder's minimum raise shows 4 card support but only 6-9 HCP. Even if partner has the maximum for his bid there is not enough for game i.e. 15+9 = 24

B

4♥. Opener has 16 HCP and a good 5 card hearts suit. Responder's jump raise shows 4 card support and 10-12 HCP. Even if partner is minimum for his bid you have enough for game so bid it! (16+10=26)

C

Pass. Opener has 15 HCP. Responder's 1NT bid denies 4 cards in hearts and shows 6-9 HCP. Opener has only 4 cards in hearts and a balanced hand so is happy to play in NT but the partnership has not enough for game even if responder is maximum for his bid (15 + 9 = 24)

4 What would be your opening lead against 4 Spades holding the following?

A ♠ A
 ♥ A K 8
 ♦ T 9 8 7
 ♣ 8 7 6 4 3

♥ A
 Why?
Top of touching honours.

| B | ♠ 9 7 6 5 ♥ 9 ♦ A 8 7 ♣ 8 7 6 4 3 | ♥ 9 Why? <i>Singleton. You are hoping you can get a ruff.</i> |
| C | ♠ A ♥ Q J 9 7 6 ♦ T ♣ 8 7 6 4 3 2 | ♥ Q Why? <i>Top of touching honours – no point leading singleton Diamond – you don't want a ruff. Your Ace Spades is always making.</i> |

5 What is your score in the following situations? ? Assume your side is non vulnerable in all cases.

A You are in 3♠ and you make 3 (taking 9 tricks)

140. You get 30 for each major suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made.

B You are in 3♠ and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks)

170. You get 30 for each major suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made.

C You are in 4 Diamonds and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks)

130. You get 20 for each minor suit trick made plus 50 for the part score bid and made. Did you remember that in a minor suit you need to bid and make 5 to score the game because a minor suit trick is only worth 20?

D You are in 4 Hearts and you make 4 (taking 10 tricks) Your side is non-vulnerable.

420. You get 30 for each major trick made (4 x 30) = 120 plus a game bonus score non vulnerable of 300 gives a total of 420.

E What is your score in Question D above if your side was vulnerable?

620. You get the same trick score of 4x30 = 120 but your game bonus vulnerable is 500!
