1. Balanced hands not $\mathbf{1 2}$ to 14 . With four hearts and four spades open $1 \square$, Otherwise open the longest suit or the higher ranking of 24 -card suits.
2. Unbalanced hands: always open the longest suit. With 25 -card or longer suits always open the higher ranking. Consider Rule of 20 for light openings.
3. 4441 hands: open middle of touching suits or suit below the singleton
4. Rule of $\mathbf{2 0}$ : If HCP + length of 2 longest suits is $20+$ consider opening with 10 HCP
5. NT rebids: After 1 level response $1 \mathrm{NT}=15-16 ; 2 \mathrm{NT}=17-18 ; 3 \mathrm{NT}=$ 19
6. 2NT response to Weak 2 opener
