- 1. Balanced hands not 12 to 14. With four hearts and four spades open 1□, Otherwise open the longest suit or the higher ranking of 2 4-card suits.
- 2. Unbalanced hands: always open the longest suit. With 2 5-card or longer suits always open the higher ranking. Consider Rule of 20 for light openings.
- 3. 4441 hands: open middle of touching suits or suit below the singleton
- **4. Rule of 20** : If HCP + length of 2 longest suits is 20+ consider opening with 10 HCP
- **5.** NT rebids: After 1 level response 1NT = 15-16; 2NT = 17-18; 3NT = 19
- 6. 2NT response to Weak 2 opener
