### ASPECTS OF SYSTEM WHICH OPPONENTS SHOULD NOTE

1♣ or 1♦ opener shows a minimum of 3 cards

1NT opener may include a 5 card major or a singleton

2NT response to Stayman shows both majors

---

STRENGTH OF 1NT OPENERS: 12-14

2♣ RESPONSE TO 1NT OPENER IS: Stayman

---

Both players of a partnership must have identically completed convention cards.  
Cards must be exchanged with opponents for each round.
