Note 1 Four suit transfers as response to p opening 1NT: $2 \mathrm{D}>2 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{H}>2 \mathrm{~S}, 2 \mathrm{~S}>\mathrm{C}$ or D . Opener bids clubs and responder passes or corrects

Note 2 OGUST 2NT enquiry after weak 2 opener in major. Responses:

- $\quad 3 C=5-7$ pts and poor suit
- $3 \mathrm{D}=5-7 \mathrm{pts}$ and good suit
- $3 \mathrm{H}=8-10$ pts and poor suit
- $3 \mathrm{~S}=8-10 \mathrm{pts}$ and good suit

Note 3 Multi-Landy defence to NT Overcalls:
2C = both majors

- $2 \mathrm{D}=6$-card major
