Note 1: With Inverted Minors and Jacoby, system is ON after intervening double, but OFF after preceding or intervening opposition bid.

Note 2: Responses/Transfers to 1NT:

2C 4-card Stayman

2D > 2H, 2H > 2S, 2S > 3C

Note 3: Helvic Wriggle. When 1NT is doubled, Stayman and transfers are off. Suit bid shows lower of two 4-card suits. Redouble shows unspecified 5-card suit in weak hand. Opener bids 2C, pass or correct.

Note 4: Response to 2C opener:

- 2D shows no Aces (but otherwise unlimited points)
- 2H, 2S, 3C, 3D show that Ace (only)
- 2NT shows two Aces.

Note 5: After 1 suit - 1 Maj - 1NT, 2C is Checkback Stayman looking for 4-4 or 5-3 fit.

Note 6: Multi-Landy defence to 1NT:
