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CARDING METHODS	Describe Primary method. State alternative in brackets.
On Partner's lead	Ace or Queen for Reverse attitude (low encourages, high discourages), King for count
On Declarer's lead	Normal count (high-low = even number)
When Discarding	1 st discard = reverse attitude
Exceptions to above	Suit preference if a singleton or King in dummy

- 1) 1NT rebid = 15-17 2NT rebid = 18-19
- 2) After a Michaels bid:

2NT = enquiry 3C = weak with clubs
 3D = weak with diamonds
 3H = strong with clubs
 3S = strong with diamonds

3C = pass or correct to 3D
- 3) Checkback over 1NT rebid – support partner’s suit first
- 4) Transfer breaks of majors: 3M = 4 cards and min
 Cue = 4 cards and max
- 5) Jacoby: 1M – 2NT shows 15+ points (or equivalent) with 4 card support, GF
Opener’s rebids: 3y = shortage (singleton or void)

 4y = good second 5 card suit
 3M = maximum, likely 6 cards
 4M = minimum
- 6) 1x – 3NT shows 12-15 with 4 card support, likely 4-3-3-3

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF SYSTEM

Weak NT, Weak 2s in 3 suits



Style of leads, signals, discards:-
4th from a good suit, 2nd from a poor suit
Ace/Queen asks for reverse attitude, King asks for count
Count on declarer’s lead
1st discard reverse attitude

**ASPECTS OF SYSTEM WHICH
OPONENTS SHOULD NOTE**

Weak 2 openings in D, H and S

STRENGTH OF 1NT OPENERS: 12-14

2♣ RESPONSE TO 1NT OPENER IS: Stayman (promissory)

Both players of a partnership must have identically completed convention cards.
Cards must be exchanged with opponents for each round.

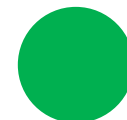
