- 2 Quantitative 4NT: Over 1NT = 19-20 points inviting slam Over 2NT = 11-12 points – inviting slam
- 3 Features 2NT: Responder is strong and usually has 3+ card support; Opener is asked to show a feature in a side suit, i.e. an Ace or King, by bidding that suit at the three level.
