## Tom Furness




## Aleks Birdsall


### **Denise Walsh**






## Peggy Bayer

### **Kester Woolley**



### **Caleb Hazley**






## **David Goodall**

I'm Harry I'm 22 from Glasgow enjoy watching football, nfl, rugby. lol don't have clue what to put


## Troy Van de L'Isle *Non Playing Captain*
