SBU Women's Trial 2019-20 - Supplementary Conditions of Contest

Overview

- 1. The SBU Women's Trial relates to the selection of the team for the 2020 Home International Series Lady Milne Trophy and the Women's Series of the 2020 European Team Championship.
- 2. The 2019-20 trial process will consist of one long weekend: Nov 29 & 30 and Dec 1 2019 with play starting on the Friday afternoon
- 3. The leading team from the trial will be selected for the Lady Milne Trophy team on 17-19 April 2020 in England.
- 4. The leading team will also be invited to represent Scotland in the Women's Series of the 2020 European Team Championship in Funchal, Madeira
- 5. Substitutes for teams of 4 will be allowed only at the discretion of an International Committee Group (ICG) made up of the IC Convener, a member of the IC not playing and the SBU President. A substitute cannot qualify for automatic selection. The Committee will have an absolute discretion to decide the extent, if any, to which the results of affected matches should be allowed to stand and whether the team in question will be allowed to continue. The Committee has full discretion to determine if the winning team still qualifies for selection if they have used a substitute.
- 6. The Director in Charge may authorise an emergency substitution on the day itself, in which case a full report shall be made to the Committee.

Authority

7. This document is supplementary to the General Conditions of Contest for the Scottish National League and SBU Trials and is established by the International Committee ("Committee") of the Scottish Bridge Union.

Entry

- 8. Entries from teams of four players should be sent to the Secretary of the Committee, Ms Anne Perkins, email anne_perkins@blueyonder.co.uk. The closing date for entries is 27 October 2019. All entries will be acknowledged.
- 9. The Committee reserves the right to accept late entries at its absolute discretion.
- 10. The entry fee for the trial is £200 per team. The Secretary can provide the SBU bank details to facilitate electronic transfers which should be completed by 30 September 2019.
- 11. If the final number of entries is too few to run any stage of the trial effectively, the Committee reserves the right to change the format.

Dates

12. The trial will be held on Nov 29 & 30 and Dec 1 2019 at the New Melville Bridge Club, Edinburgh

Event format

- 13. The format is dependent on the number of teams entering. The likely format with 4 teams is a quadruple round robin of 3×14 board matches over the Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
- 14. In each case, matches will be scored in IMP and converted to VP.
- 15. Screens will be used.

Systems and conventions

- 16. The trial will be run as a Category 1 SBU competition.
- 17. The SBU regulation prohibiting the psyching of strong, artificial, forcing opening bids does not apply to this event.
- 18. It is advisable to have system notes with you as per the Europeans since it is to your advantage to have them available for scrutiny by TDs if it should be necessary.

Lady Milne selection

- 19. The Committee will automatically select both pairs from the winning team.
- 20. The Committee will select a pair to fill the remaining place from amongst players who have competed in the trial, taking into account performance in the trial and results in recent national and international events.

European Team Championships selection

- 21. The winning team will be invited to represent Scotland in the Women's Series of the 2020 European Team Championships if it has two pairs who both wish to participate.
- 22. If the winning team does not have two pairs who wish to play in the Europeans, then the team that finishes second will be invited to form the team so long as both its pairs wish to participate. The third pair will be chosen by the International Committee in consultation with the two qualified pairs, taking into account performance in the trials and recent national and international events
- 23. In the event that neither of the teams finishing first nor second wish to participate, then the International Committee may select a team from the remaining pairs taking into account their performance in the trial and in recent national and international events.
- 24. The selected team will be expected to participate in an appropriate program of preparation as agreed with your NPC prior to the championships. Failure to comply with this requirement without reasonable cause may jeopardise selection to represent Scotland in future years.
- 25. If any of the three selected pairs is later unable to play or if an individual has to withdraw, the Committee will make alternative arrangements.
